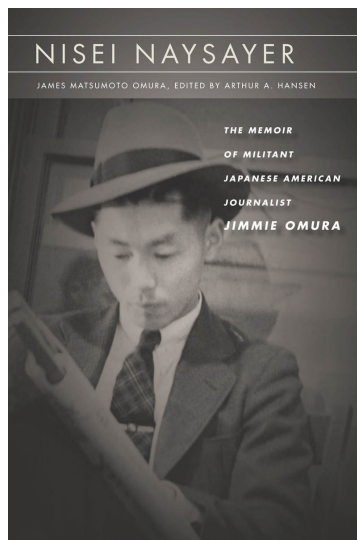

At this special event, Art Hansen will share excerpts from an upcoming memoir of the late Nisei journalist James "Jimmie" Matsumoto Omura, which will touch upon Omura's World War II court trial that stemmed from his support of the Heart Mountain Draft resisters. This event will also discuss the importance of the UCLA Asian American Studies Center's Suyama Project, which aims to preserve the history of Japanese American resistance during World War II, including, but not limited to the 100th/442nd Regimental Combat Team draftees, Army and draft resisters, No-Nos, renunciants, and other Nikkei dissidents of World War II. Arthur A. Hansen, Professor Emeritus of History, California State University, Fullerton, is a renowned historian whose life's work revolves around the collection, analysis, and presentation of original oral history interviews having to do with Japanese American incarceration. Over the past four decades he has also put Nisei resistance to this injustice on the record. Hansen's many publications and books exemplify the history of resistance that the Suyama Project web site aims to reinforce and expand through the digitization of artifacts such as letters, diaries, photos, and other evidence from the 1940s.
